Ashville Sheds Light on Our Park Track

Every year the Park Committee, Mayor, and Village Council review the park condition and determine what enhancements would be beneficial to the community. Last year the open-shelter house was repaired and the Teays Valley Senior Football Players painted the Gazebo. Chester Gloyd, Terry Moore, and Keith Moore are members of the Park Committee. A new member of this committee is John Gray, President of the Ashville Community Club. The Club has partnered with the village on park initiatives. The park is a very important part of functions of their organization. For the village and specifically for this project they are contributing \$3,500 for the lights to go around the track. The project will have a total cost of about \$14,773.

Council Member Chester Gloyd was instrumental in getting this project done. In the first photo you see him with Brock Riley digging the trench where the electrical line is buried. The next photo shows the concrete foundation for the light poles being poured. While Mr. Gloyd dug the trench, the village staff, including David Ballard, Gregg Sturgill, Harold Partee, and David McMillion, helped with soil replacement and compacting. They were there to assist when the trencher encounter large items that need removal by the backhoe.

The bottom left photo shows the light poles being installed. The last photo on the bottom right shows the lights in operation. People who like walking on the track later in the evening will be able to do that more easily under the "lights".
