

RE: Community Park Improvements, Village of Ashville, OH

This letter is in response to correspondence, received on July 2, 2002. We offer comments pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, as amended, and the associated regulations at 36 CFR Part 800.

We have reviewed a copy of the application that you provided for Natureworks/Land and Water Conservation Fund. We have no records of previously surveyed historic properties in the area and the information submitted does not show any previously unidentified properties. It is possible that archaeological resources will be present at this site, given the topography of the area and previous survey data. However, given the scope of the proposed work it is unlikely that there would be any significant impact to resources if any were present. Therefore, it is our opinion that no historic properties will be affected by the proposed project.
