Pedestrian Enhanced Intersection Improvement Project

Dear Mr. Shaner:

The TAP Application has been submitted with three (3) Exhibits and six (6) Attachments. This will be the second TAP Application from Ashville and the third for Pickaway County. We hope to get funded this time.

The Village of Ashville Sidewalk and Train Plan Attachment indicates that Ashville has participated with Pickaway County and Harrison Township in development of a plan. We are now engaged with the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission (MORPC) in extending that plan beyond Pickaway County to the Central Ohio Region. Ashville is a member of MORPC and I am on the MORPC Executive Committee.

Ashville's objective is to connect with the region for economic development, housing, transportation, utilities, and sidewalks/trails. Since State Route 316 travels through the heart of our village it will be an integral part of any pedestrian connection to South Bloomfield, Harrison Township, Pickaway County and Central Ohio. The Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB) and Street Lights would fit into this plan and help with pedestrian traffic to Ashville Elementary, Teays Valley East Middle School and Teays Valley High School.
