Ashville is located close to the center of Ohio. Ashville is between the Pickaway, Fairfield county. Ashville has 2.51 square miles of land area and has no water area. As of 2010-2014, the total Ashville population is 4,130, which has grown $30.12 \%$ since 2000 . The population growth rate is much higher than the state average rate of $1.83 \%$ and is much higher than the national average rate of $11.61 \%$. Ashville median household income is $\$ 54,219$ in 2010-2014 and has grown by $32.96 \%$ since 2000 . The income growth rate is much higher than the state average rate of $19.27 \%$ and is higher than the national average rate of $27.36 \%$. Ashville median house value is $\$ 148,700$ in $2010-2014$ and has grown by $27.86 \%$ since 2000 . The house value growth rate is higher than the state average rate of $24.98 \%$ and is much lower than the national average rate of $46.91 \%$. As a reference, the national Consumer Price Index (CPI) inflation rate for the same period is $26.63 \%$. On average, the public school district that covers Ashville is close to the state average in quality. The Ashville area code is 740.

As of 2010-2014, the per capita income of Ashville is $\$ 21,795$, which is lower than the state average of $\$ 26,520$ and is lower than the national average of $\$ 28,555$. Ashville median household income is $\$ 54,219$, which has grown by $32.96 \%$ since 2000 . The median household income growth rate is much higher than the state average rate of $19.27 \%$ and is higher than the national average rate of $27.36 \%$. On average Ashville residents spend 27.3 minutes per day commuting to work, which is higher than the state average of 22.8 minutes and is higher than the national average of 25.7 minutes.

[6] "Spouse" represents spouse of the householder. It does not reflect all spouses in a household. Responses of "same-sex spouse" were edited during processing to "unmarried partner."
[7] "Family households" consist of a householder and one or more other people related to the householder by birth, marriage, or adoption. They do not include same-sex married couples even if the marriage was performed in a state issuing marriage certificates for same-sex couples. Same-sex couple households are included in the family households category if there is at least one additional person related to the householder by birth or adoption. Same-sex couple households with no relatives of the householder present are tabulated in nonfamily households. "Nonfamily households" consist of people living alone and households which do not have any members related to the householder.
[8] The homeowner vacancy rate is the proportion of the homeowner inventory that is vacant "for sale." It is computed by dividing the total number of vacant units "for sale only" by the sum of owner-occupied units, vacant units that are "for sale only," and vacant units that have been sold but not yet occupied; and then multiplying by 100.
[9] The rental vacancy rate is the proportion of the rental inventory that is vacant "for rent." It is computed by dividing the total number of vacant units "for rent" by the sum of the renter-occupied units, vacant units that are "for rent," and vacant units that have been rented but not yet occupied; and then multiplying by 100 .
