**The Great Ohio Bicycle Adventure is coming to Ashville on June 19<sup>th</sup>**

**What is GOBA?**  
It is The Great Ohio Bicycle Adventure. An annual one-week bicycle loop tour through Ohio, held each June. GOBA features a different part of Ohio each year, traveling through peaceful countryside and stopping at exciting tourist destinations. The week-long adventure offers fun, Ohio hospitality, and a challenging and rewarding vacation.

Specifically in Ashville we will be transformed into GOBAville on Tuesday, June 19<sup>th</sup>. Participants will enjoy great entertainment, food and fun! Evening entertainment at the Ashville Village Park which will feature Ashville's very popular family act, The Rainey's, along with The WoRKS, a band fea-

turing former members of the legendary Pickaway County band Mocassin Creek. Several other activities are in the works including karaoke, yoga and movies, as well as the opportunity to tour Ashville's Small Town Museum.

**What to expect?**  
Around 3,000 cyclists of all ages, from all across the country (and from outside the U.S.), participate each year, riding a 50-mile (average) route each day, through some of Ohio's most scenic areas. GOBA is a tour, not a race; most riders find plenty of time during the day for sightseeing, snoozing on the grass, and enjoying food along the way. The bicyclers and support personnel will be spending the night at

Teays Valley High School. GOBA is a project of Columbus Outdoor Pursuits (COP), a volunteer-based participatory organization created to provide opportunities and education for outdoor recreation and activities.

While perhaps best known for its bicycle tours, the Tour of the Scioto River Valley (TOSRV) and GOBA, COP also features a comprehensive program of activities and education in bicycling and bicycling safety, leadership training, flat- and white-water boating, caving, backpacking, rock climbing, skiing, and other modes of outdoor recreation.



## Police Beat 04-2012

As the weather warms up we have seen an increase of bicycle use on the village roadways. Please ride responsibly and safely so that you can enjoy the spring and summer weather. Here are some helpful hints to keep you safe while riding on roadways:



Always ride on the right side of the road with traffic. Bicycles are classified as vehicles in Ohio, and as such, must be operated on the right side of the road.

Obey traffic control devices such as stop signs and red lights. Motorists who have the right-of-way may not be able to stop in time if a bicyclist runs a stop sign or red light.

Signal turns and stops. A motorist may attempt to pass a bicyclist who is turning if the bicyclist does not signal first.

And please, ALWAYS wear a helmet. In an accident with a motor vehicle or even the pavement, the bicyclist never comes out on top.

We hope this process will allow businesses or organizations to have special events but in balance to the people that may live in areas that are affected.
