

If you have not heard there is a local issue that involves the health and safety of our Ashville community.

The Village Council of Ashville voted on October 7th to authorize a Resolution in support of the local fire levy. A copy of that resolution of support is reprinted on page two (2).

The reported number of emergency calls in 2010 totaled in the 1,600s; in 2013, this is projected to be over 2,000. According to Melissa Betz, county auditor, the levy would generate about \$383,000 per year with a full tax collection. Passage of the levy would cost taxpayers \$87.50 per year on a home value of \$100,000. This information is from the October 22, 2013 Circleville Herald, www.circlevilletoday.com.

Leaf Pick-up Ashville's Service Department



The Village's Leaf pick-up service has already begun. It is scheduled to continue through Monday, December 2nd. The exact date is driven in large part by weather and the leaves on the ground. The next newsletter issue will talk about the village's work for snow and ice removal. This usually follows leaf pick-up but they may overlap.

In the past the Service Department had a specific street schedule Monday through Friday. With the equipment we now have the entire village is checked each day.

NOTE: To be removed leaves must be taken to the street. The day to day pick-up may be changed due to inclement weather or reasons beyond our control.

WHAT TO AVOID>>>>>>>>

Leaves piled in front or back of vehicles will not be picked-up; we use the ten (10) "foot rule" to prevent damage. It is also helpful not to place leaves under low hanging tree limbs because of the height of our equipment. No brush or flowers will be picked up. Local Waste Ser-

vices on Monday's Collection Day will take limbs that are bundled or weeds (flowers) that are bagged. They will also take bagged leaves.

The size of our equipment prevents us from traveling in alleys.



A RESOLUTION OF SUPPORT FOR THE 2.5 MIL LEVY FOR THE HARRISON TOWNSHIP FIRE DEPARTMENT



Whereas, it is desirable to provide the health, safety public good within the Village of Ashville.

NOW, AND THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL, VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE, PICKAWAY COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO THAT:

SECTION ONE:

The Village Council voted on October 7, 2013 to authorize the Village Administrator to prepare a resolution of support for the November 5, 2013 Harrison Township Fire Levy.

SECTION TWO:

The Harrison Township Fire Department:

- Has existed for 130 Years.
- Provides fire and emergency squad protection for Harrison and Walnut Townships and large parts of Jackson, Madison, and Mühlenberg Townships for a total of 127 square miles.
- Provides mutual aid to all surrounding Fire and EMS agencies.
- Provides home fire safety inspections.
- Provides CPR training at the department, in the community, and for the workforce
- Provides fire prevention and station tours for schools and community organizations.
- Provides Blood drives and blood pressure checks

The Harrison Township Fire Department Profile in Statistics:

- In 2012 there were over 1800 Fire and EMS runs, averaging 5 runs/day.
- The department employs 13 full-time and several part-time employees.
- Each 24 hour shift is staffed with 4 full-time and two part-time employees
