


"Bicycle Safety"

As the weather gets warmer and school draws to a close, parents please be aware of where your children are at night. The Village of Ashville does have a curfew for minors. This curfew exists not only to mitigate offenses such as vandalism and theft, but also to protect our children from those who might seek to exploit them. Please help us to keep the children of our community safe.

No minor under the age of eighteen years shall be outside their residence and/or property between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. the following day unless accompanied by their parent, guardian or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor, or when the minor is on an emergency errand or legitimate business directed by his parent, guardian or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor. (Codified Village Ordinance Number 537.19)
