**Utility Rate and Refuse Rate Update for 2016**



The 2014 monthly rate was \$15.23. In 2015 that rate was \$14.55. The rate increase for 2016 is 77¢. Therefore the refuse rate in your next bill will be \$15.32. The senior citizen rate will go from \$13.05 to \$13.79, which represents a 10% discount. To be eligible for the Senior Discount you must be 62 or older and the head of household. To obtain this Senior Citizen Discount visit the Administrative Office at 200 Station Street East during regular business hours to sign-up for the 10% Senior Citizen Discount. For validation purposes bring a Driver's Licenses or State of Ohio ID.

This service will continue to provide recycling. Green recycle bins are available at the administrative office. You can also get a larger container, a red 65 gallon recycling cart for \$2.00 the same price as the black 96 gallon refuse cart. You will need to contact Local Waste Service (LWS) to obtain cart (s) at 614/409-9375 or 740/756-7156 or email [www.info@localwasteservices.com](mailto:www.info@localwasteservices.com)



LWS begins recycle pick-up at 6:00 am. Refuse and recycle are picked up by two separate trucks, therefore different times. We suggest putting trash and recycle out on Sunday night.



The Consumer Price Index (CPI) for 2015 was .7%. This will result in a slight increase in the base water and sewer charge. The increase for water will be 3¢ or from \$3.42 to \$3.45 and for wastewater 5¢ or from \$6.94 to \$6.99 per thousand gallons.



In June 2015, Ordinance 2015-04 was passed in anticipation of the construction of a new wastewater treatment plant, required by the OhioEPA. It increased the Debt Service from 69¢ to \$1.29 or a 60¢ increase. In June of 2016 Village Council will be looking at the cost of building the Water Resource Recovery Facility. It is like there will be a need for an additional increase of 66¢ for debt service resulting in \$1.95 per thousand gallons. When that takes place that notification will be in the newsletter, website, Facebook and Twitter.



The web-portal for paying bills is now operational. This article is designed to highlight the most frequent questions we are getting concerning how to use.

*"I cannot find it on the Ashville webpage?"*

There are three ways to access the web-portal page.

1. After going to [www.ashvilleohio.gov](http://www.ashvilleohio.gov) click on the "Utility Online" icon at the top right side of the webpage.
  2. Go to <https://ashvilleohio.epayub.com>
- On our home page go to Utility Department or "Utility Online" dropdown box.



*"The web-portal page will not allow me to register?"*

There are two possible reasons.

1. The account number needs to be entered exactly as the number appears on your bill, including all zeros.
2. The name needs to be entered exactly as it appears on your bill, including case sensitive and any initials.

*"Why is there a fee?"*

It is the third party cost to have this feature and only they receive this fee, none of this goes to the Village of Ashville.

*"Can it automatically come out each month?"* No.

The charge is based upon usage. Therefore, the amount can vary. The following represents both a moderate and extreme example of a leak that can and has occurred in the village.

A "running" toilet can waste 2 gallons of water per minute (...that's 96,000 gallons or \$1,163.75 a month). A "silent leak" in a toilet can waste up to 7,000 gallons or \$73.50 of water per month. From EBMUD and This Old House. The lowest usage possible is 1,000 gallons for \$12.25 or \$29.80 including Refuse and Stormwater. **IMPORTANT NOTICE** The Ohio EPA will make available for public review a Preliminary Environmental Assessment (EA) of the Water Resource Recovery Project and finding of no significant impact (FONSI). The public will have a 30-day period in which to review the environmental assessment and provide comments back to Ohio EPA to the staff environmental planner listed at the back of the document. The project consists of construction of a new wastewater facility located south of State Route 752. 
