RESOLUTION 03 - 2019

OF THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE

A RESOLUTION APPROVING THE RESTATEMENT OF THE MADISON TOWNSHIP JOINT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT AGREEMENT & ANNEXATION MORATORIUM AGREEMENT BY REFERENCE AND THE EXECUTION OF AN AMENDMENT TO MADISON TOWNSHIP JOINT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT CONTRACT WITH THE TOWNSHIP OF MADISON AND THE CITY OF COLUMBUS.



WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("R.C.") Sections 715.72 – 715.81 (the "JEDD Statutes"), the City of Columbus (the "City"), Madison Township (the "Township") and the Village of Ashville (this "Village") executed a Joint Economic Development District Contract, executed as of June 30, 2010 (the "Original JEDD Contract"), creating the Madison Township Joint Economic Development District (the "JEDD") Exhibit A. The JEDD currently encompasses a portion of the Township (the "Original JEDD Area"). The parties to the Original JEDD Contract wish to Amend and Restate the Original JEDD Contract Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Original JEDD Contract, the Board of Directors for the JEDD (the "JEDD Board") imposed a 2.50% tax on income withheld from employees working within the JEDD Territory and on net business profits sitused to the Original JEDD Area; and

WHEREAS, the Petitioners desire to develop parcels of land for commercial purposes (the "Project" or "Project Area") at a site within the boundaries of the Township (the "JEDD Addition," which is further described on the attached Exhibit C and incorporated herein by this reference), provided that the appropriate economic development incentives are available to support the economic viability of the Project. The JEDD Addition is located outside of the Original JEDD Area. The Original JEDD Area and the JEDD Addition are referred to collectively here in as the "Expanded JEDD Area." The Expanded JEDD Area is depicted on Exhibit B hereto and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the Village Council (this "Village Council") of this Village desires to add the JEDD Addition to the Original JEDD Area by executing a Second Amendment to Madison Township Joint Economic Development Contract (the "Second Amendment to JEDD Contract"), substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, this Village Council desires to enter into the Second Amendment to JEDD Contract for the purpose of facilitating economic development, to create jobs and employment opportunities and to improve the economic welfare of the people in the City, the Township, this Village, Pickaway County (the "County"), and the State of Ohio (the "State") and anticipates that adding the JEDD Addition to the Original JEDD Area will bring economic development, jobs and revenue to this City, the Township, the County and the State; and

WHEREAS, the JEDD Addition meets all of the criteria set forth in R.C. Section 715.73; and

WHEREAS, this Village Council has authority to enter into the Second Amendment to JEDD Contract pursuant to the JEDD Statutes; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. Sections 715.761, this Village Council has made available for public inspection a copy of the Second Amendment to JEDD Contract, a description of the area to be added to the Original JEDD Area, and a map of the area to be added to the Original JEDD Area in sufficient detail to denote the specific boundaries of the area and to indicate any zoning restrictions applicable to the area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. Sections 715.761 and 715.75, this Village Council has published a notice of public hearing in a newspaper of general circulation in this Village, certificates of which are attached hereto as Exhibit D; and

WHEREAS, the Petitioners, as the only owner of the JEDD Addition and the Developers as the only owners of a business located within the JEDD Addition, have filed property owner and business owner petitions pursuant to R.C. Section 715.761(C)(6), thus alleviating the need for this Village to give notice as would otherwise have been required under R.C. Section 715.76; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. Sections 715.761(B) and 715.75(C), this Village Council caused a copy of the Second Amendment to JEDD Contract to be delivered to the Board of County Commissions of Pickaway County on February ______, 2019; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to R.C. Sections 715.76 and 715.761, this Village Council has held a public hearing allowing for public comment and recommendations on the Second Amendment to JEDD Contract and the JEDD; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("R.C.") Section 709.192, the City, the Township and this Village executed the Madison Township Annexation Moratorium Agreement (the "Original AMA") effective June 30, 2010. A copy of the Original AMA is attached hereto as Exhibit E and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the Original AMA originally encompassed a portion of the Township (the "Original AMA Area"), commonly referred to as the Northern Industrial Area, as depicted on the map attached as in Exhibit A of Exhibit E to the Original AMA and incorporated herein by this reference; and

WHEREAS, the City, the Township, this Village and the Developers desire to reaffirm that the Project Area is included in the Original AMA Area by executing the Restatement and Second Amendment to Madison Township Annexation Moratorium Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit E. The Original AMA Area and the Project Area are referred to collectively here in as the "Reaffirmed AMA Area." The Reaffirmed AMA Area is depicted on Exhibit F hereto and incorporated herein by this reference

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL FOR THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE, PICKAWAY COUNTY, OHIO THAT:

SECTION 1. This Village Council hereby finds and determines that the terms of the Second Amendment to JEDD Contract are in the best interests of this Village and its residents and will enhance economic development, create jobs and employment opportunities, and improve the economic welfare of the people in this Village, the Township, the City, the County, and the State.

SECTION 2. This Village Council hereby approves the execution of the Agreement Restatement and Second Amendment to JEDD Contract and the Second Amendment to Madison Township Annexation Moratorium Agreement, freely and without duress or coercion, and authorizes the Village Administrator to execute the Second Amended JEDD Contract and the Second Amendment to Madison Township Annexation Moratorium Agreement on behalf of this Village substantially in the form attached hereto as Exhibit B, with such non-material and/or non-adverse changes as may be deemed appropriate by the Village Administrator and one other member of this Village Council. Such execution on behalf of this Village shall constitute conclusive evidence of this Village Council's approval of any such changes. This Village Council further authorizes and directs the Village Administrator and one other member of this Village Council to take any further actions, and to execute and deliver any further agreements, certificates or documents that are necessary, reasonable or appropriate to carry out the purposes of the Second Amended JEDD Contract and the Second Amendment to Madison Township Annexation Moratorium Agreement.

SECTION 3. This Village Council hereby authorizes and directs the Clerk of this Village Council to file with the Board of County Commissioners of Pickaway County, in conjunction with the City and Township, all documents required to be filed under R.C. Sections 715.76 and 715.761, including, without limitation, (i) a signed copy of the Second Amendment to JEDD Contract, (ii) a description of the area to be added to the Original JEDD Area, including a map in sufficient detail to denote the specific boundaries of the area and to indicate any zoning restrictions applicable to the area, (iii) a certified copy of this Resolution, (iv) a certificate of this Village that the public hearings required by R.C. Sections 715.761 and R.C. 715.75 were held, the date of the hearings, and evidence of publication of the notice of the hearings, (v) the petition signed by the Authority as the only owner of the JEDD Addition and (vi) the petition signed by the Developers as the only owners of a business located within the JEDD Addition.

SECTION 4. This Village Council hereby consents, pursuant to R.C. Section 715.81, to the granting of tax exemptions in the Expanded JEDD Area, including but not limited to exemptions under R.C. Section 3735.67, notwithstanding anything to the contrary in the JEDD Agreement.

SECTION 5. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Village Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Village Council, and that all deliberations of this Village Council and any decision making bodies of the City and Township that resulted in such formal actions were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements.

SECTION 6. This Resolution shall take effect and be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption.

OF THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE

A RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE, PICKAWAY COUNTY, SUPPORTING HOUSE BILL 62 STATE TRANSPORTATION BUDGET TO IMPOSE AN ADDITIONAL 18¢ PER GALLON ON GASOLINE. THE GASOLINE TAX WILL PROVIDE FUNDING OF INFRASTRUCTURE OF THE STATE, COUNTY, AND VILLAGE PRESERVING FUTURE ROADWAY INFRASTRUCTURE Maintenance and Development, and Declaring an Emergency.

WHEREAS, the Village of Ashville Council from time to makes an endorsement that will directly and indirectly benefit the community of Ashville; and

WHEREAS, Ohio is facing a transportation shortfall in funding. The preliminary budget plan for fiscal years 2020 and 2021 is a significant concern. The vast majority of revenues are allocated for maintenance rather than increasing capacity. This is demonstrated by the decreasing size of the ODOT capital program from a high of approximately \$2.4 billion in fiscal year 2014 to approximately \$1.7 billion in fiscal year 2020. In order to meet its requirement to present a balanced budget, ODOT projects an across the board 10% cut to discretionary funds; and

WHEREAS, Central Ohio communities know first-hand of the unmet need for transportation funding requests. For example, Ashville has \$250,000 available in funding during our current appropriation budget, but over \$2 million in requests that cannot be funded; and

WHEREAS, reduced funding will also worsen economic costs of congestion. For Central Ohio, the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission (MORPC) estimates congestion to cost over \$921 million annually due to travel delay and excess fuel consumption as well as health impacts from reduced air quality. Poor road conditions from deferred maintenance cost each driver an estimated \$533 annually; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Constitution requires that 40 percent of revenue from motor fuel user fee is dedicated to the construction and maintaining of local roads and bridges; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Ashville Council concurs with the conclusion reached by the Fix Our Roads Ohio (FOR Ohio) coalition of stakeholders which include the following; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Taxation has provided the following information:

- Increases the per gallon rates of the motor fuel tax and the motor fuel use tax from 28¢ to 46¢ beginning July 1, 2019.
- Indexes the per gallon rate of the taxes with the consumer price index (CPI) to account for inflation beginning July 1, 2020.
- Maintains current revenue distribution proportions and amounts.
- Allows fuel dealer and retailer discounts and allowances to return to their former (higher) levels.
- Increases the refund for fuel used in school buses from 6¢ per gallon to 24¢ per gallon beginning July 1, 2019.
- Maintains existing cents-per-gallon refund levels for fuel used in transit and developmental disability system buses.
- Requires that the amount deposited to the Motor Fuel Tax Administration Fund be determined by appropriation rather than as a percentage of motor fuel tax receipts.; and,

WHEREAS, the Village of Ashville Council joins with the Mid-Ohio Planning Organization (MORPC), Ohio Municipal League (OML), and the above organization in their support of providing stable financing of roadway infrastructure.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE OFFICIAL INTENT AND REASONABLE EXPECTATION OF THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE ON BEHALF OF THE STATE OF OHIO (THE BORROWER) TO REIMBURSE ITS STREET AND STORMWATER IMPROVEMENT FUND FOR THE STATE ROUTE 316 IMPROVEMENT PROJECT, PROJECT NO. CT46W/CQ49W WITH THE PROCEEDS OF TAX EXEMPT DEBT OF THE STATE OF OHIO AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Ashville on behalf of the State of Ohio that:

Section 1. The Council of the Village of Ashville reasonably expects to receive a reimbursement for the Project named The State Route 316 Improvement Project, Project No. CT46W/CQ49W as set forth in Appendix A of the Project Agreement with the proceeds of bonds to be issued by the State of Ohio.

Section 2. The maximum aggregate principal amount of bonds, other than for costs of issuance, expected to be issued by the State of Ohio for reimbursement to the local subdivision is \$510,037.



Dear Mr. Christman,

We are pleased to submit this proposal for residential and commercial building department services to The Village of Ashville. We propose to provide the following services to Village for the period August 1, 2019 through December 31, 2020.

- 1. Chief Building Official/Residential Building Official: The Chief Building Official shall have and maintain all Ohio certifications in accordance with the Ohio Building Code (OBC). The Chief Building Official is responsible for building department administration. The Building Official shall issue Certificates of Plan Approval for Construction, Certificates of Occupancy, and all other orders as may be necessary for enforcement of the OBC. The Chief Building Official oversees all reports required by the State.
- 2. Plans Examiner/Residential Plans Examiner: The Plans Examiner shall have and maintain all Ohio certifications in accordance with the Ohio Building Code (OBC). The primary responsibility of the Plans Examiner is to review residential and commercial building plans and specifications for compliance with the provisions of the OBC and issue a detailed plan review as directed by the OBC.
- 3. Building Inspector/Residential Building Inspector: The Building Inspector shall have and maintain all Ohio certifications in accordance with the Ohio Building Code (OBC). The Building Inspector is responsible for structural and mechanical inspections, investigation and determination of conformance and compliance with all current Ohio building codes and standards. We offer individuals who have multiple residential and commercial certifications which allows for more latitude for the time convenience of the applicant.
- 4. Electrical Inspector: The Electrical Inspector shall have and maintain all Ohio certifications in accordance with the Ohio Building Code (OBC). The Electrical Inspector is responsible for electrical inspections, investigation and determination of conformance and compliance with all current Ohio building codes and standards.
- 5. Plumbing Inspector: The Plumbing Inspector shall have and maintain all Ohio certification in accordance with the Ohio Building Code (OBC). The Plumbing Inspector is responsible for plumbing inspections, investigation and determination of conformance and compliance with all current Ohio building codes and standards.

- 6. Walk Thru Plan Review: Toole & Associates will provide walk thru plan review for those projects deemed necessary by the Chief Building Official and Plans Examiner. Projects of greater complexity that may require extensive coordination between all parties are those seen as having a use for such services. Walk thru plan review is scheduled with the Chief Building Official and Plans Examiner and generally occur in the offices of Toole & Associates. Depending on the scope of the project there may or may not be issued a plan review at the time of the walk thru.
- 7. Plan Review: It is the goal of Toole & Associates to provide timely plan review to all applicants equally. The Village of Ashville shall forward the plan s t Toole & Associates offices via UPS or local courier. We make every effort to complete commercial plan review within 10 working days of receipt of application in our office and residential plan review within 3 working days. Upon completion we will return the review to the building department either via local courier or UPS. Toole & Associates is required by the Ohio Board of Building Standards to complete all plan review in the order received and acknowledges we have up to 30 days after an application has been made to issue our review.
- 8. Professional Liability Insurance: Toole & Associates shall carry Professional Liability Insurance in the base amount of \$1,000,000. The amount of recoverable damages for any error or omission or negligence by Toole & Associates shall be limited to a maximum of the annual fees paid to Toole & Associates by the Village of Ashville for that year. Each party agrees to waive claims for inconsequential damages.
- 9. Monthly Invoices: Invoices are provided monthly by the 10th of the following month for all services performed. The Village shall review each invoice and authorize payment within thirty calendar days. Questions regarding items invoiced shall be resolved within fifteen calendar days of invoice receipt, and a replacement invoice will be submitted if required.
- 10. Duration of Agreement: This agreement shall be in effect for a period of one year. Each September moving forward Toole & Associates will provide the Village of Ashville with an updated contract for the following year that shall go in effect January 1. No services can be provided without a current contract. Adjustments in labor and/or expense rates may only be made at the time of renewal. Should either the Village of Ashville or Toole & Associates chose to end the contract a minimum of 30 days' notice in writing is required.
- 11. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced under the laws of the State of Ohio, Franklin County. Each provision of this Agreement shall be separable. If any provision of this Agreement is found to be void or unenforceable, the balance of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.



WHEREAS, the Local Government Fund was reduced in 2011 by 50% during the Kasich Administration, from 3.68% of General Revenue Funds to its current level of 1.66% of General Revenue Funds; and

WHEREAS, past Ohio General Assemblies have repeatedly decreased funding and revenue sharing in recent years in addition to significantly reducing the Local Government Fund, including eliminating the Estate Tax and phasing out the Tangible Personal Property Tax; and

WHEREAS, engaging these reductions have resulted in a loss of revenue of \$350,000; and

WHEREAS, this sudden revenue loss has made it increasingly difficult to provide basic services, rebuild infrastructure, and bolster public safety services to fight the opioid epidemic; and

WHEREAS, when municipalities experience success in fostering safe communities, building sound infrastructure, and increasing economic development, the State of Ohio reaps the benefits as well.

WHEREAS, a reinvestment of Local Government Fund would aid the state in its goal of lowering taxes on the individual by enabling municipalities to decrease the local tax burden.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE, OHIO:

SECTION ONE

The Ohio General Assembly should restore the Local Government Fund to pre-recession levels, ensuring that these local communities are able to provide crucial services and improvements in infrastructure and public safety.

SECTION TWO

This Council does hereby declare its opposition any further cuts to the Local Government Fund or the future diversion of revenues from the Local Government Fund.

DELINQUENT DEBT COLLECTION AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE OHIO ATTORNEY GENERAL AND

866-452-9893

I. PARTIES

1.1. THIS DELINQUENT DEBT COLLECTION AGREEMENT (this Agreement") is between the Ohio Attorney General (hereinafter "Attorney General") and

("Political Subdivision"), collectively referenced herein as the "Parties."

II. PURPOSE

2.1. The Political Subdivision has requested that the Attorney General undertake, and the Attorney General agrees to undertake, the collection of delinquent debt owed to the Political Subdivision, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code ("O.R.C.") § 131.02. This Agreement sets forth the rights, duties and obligations of the Parties and the amounts to be charged, collected and allocated between the Political Subdivision and Attorney General. This Agreement will become effective in ten business days once fully executed ("Effective Date").

III. CERTIFICATION OF DEBT

- 3.1. The Parties agree that this Agreement shall apply to amounts owed to Political Subdivision that meet the criteria specified on the attached Exhibit "A" (hereinafter the "Debt"). The Parties may, from time to time, change the categories of debt to be certified to the Attorney General by amending Exhibit "A" pursuant to the discretion of the Section Chief of the Collections Enforcement Section of the Attorney General and of the Political Subdivision. Such changes to the categories of debt identified on Exhibit "A" shall not be construed as an amendment or termination of this Agreement.
- 3.2. Political Subdivision hereby warrants that all Debts certified to the Attorney General for collection pursuant to this Agreement are or will be legally due and owing to Political Subdivision at the time of certification.
- 3.3. Political Subdivision hereby warrants that it has complied or will comply with all conditions precedent to the legality of certifying the Debt for collection prior to certifying the Debt to Attorney General pursuant to this Agreement.

- 3.4. Political Subdivision hereby warrants that it has obtained the approval of any person or entity whose approval is required as a condition to entering into this Agreement. True and correct copies of any such approvals shall be attached hereto as Exhibit "B."
- 3.5. Political Subdivision shall identify and itemize the amounts owed in any bills or mailings issued to the debtors prior to certifying the Debt pursuant to this Agreement. Such itemization shall separately identify penalties, fees, costs and interest, if any, added to the principal balance of the amounts owed. For all Debt certified under this Agreement, Political Subdivision shall maintain account records documenting the principal balance of the amounts owed, as well as any penalties, fees, costs and interest, from the date such debt becomes due and owing to Political Subdivision until the debt is paid in full, resolved or written off as specified herein.
- 3.6. Political Subdivision shall make all account records related to the Debt fully available to specified Attorney General personnel in order for the Attorney General to actively identify and pursue collection activities. Political Subdivision shall retain account records related to the Debt so long as the Debt remains outstanding, or until the Debt is resolved or written off as specified herein.
- 3.7. Political Subdivision agrees and shall forward all payments received on certified Debt to the Attorney General. In the event that Political Subdivision accepts a debtor's payment on Debt certified to the Attorney General, Political Subdivision agrees to promptly notify the Attorney General of the details of the payment, including date, amount, remitter, check or instrument number and forward the payment to the Attorney General.
- 3.8. In the event that any debtor owing Debt certified to the Attorney General files bankruptcy or other insolvency proceeding, Political Subdivision shall immediately notify the Attorney General of such filing. The Attorney General shall cease all collection efforts with regard to such Debt. Political Subdivision remains exclusively and solely responsible for protecting its interest in bankruptcy & other insolvency proceedings. Upon notice that Debt certified to the Attorney General is subject to bankruptcy or other insolvency proceeding, the Attorney General shall close the affected accounts and such accounts shall no longer be considered to be certified to the Attorney General. Other insolvency proceeding may include but is not limited to receivership or foreclosure.

IV. ALLOCATION OF FEES AND COLLECTION COSTS

4.1 The client may choose for each account certified to the Attorney General to bear interest (hereinafter "AGI") at the annual rate established by the Tax Commissioner under O.R.C. § 5703.47. Upon recovery AGI is paid to Political Subdivision, not to Attorney General. AGI may be waived, either by Political Subdivision or the Attorney General. Political Subdivision also has discretion to request that AGI not be assessed as an additional obligation of debtors. If this request is indicated, the cost of AGI will not be added to the Debt. Political Subdivision may execute the Service Level Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit "C" to designate the preference of Political Subdivision as to AGI. If no preference is indicated, Attorney General may waive AGI at its discretion, and the addition of AGI to the Debt will increase the debtors' obligation. The AGI is in place of any separate accruing interest of the Political Subdivision on the Debt once certified to the Attorney General.

- 4.2 Pursuant to O.R.C. § 131.02, the Attorney General is authorized to deduct the Attorney General's collection cost from all amounts collected, calculated upon all certified amounts recovered, plus interest and fees accruing from the date of certification to Attorney General. Attorney General collection costs may be waived, either by the Attorney General or jointly by the Political Subdivision and the Attorney General. The Parties agree that the Attorney General will pass all Attorney General collection costs on to the debtor as an additional obligation of debtor. The Attorney General collection cost is 10% pursuant to O.R.C. § 109.08.
- 4.3 Upon agreement, the Attorney General may also hire third party vendors to collect claims for Political Subdivision and to pay such third party vendors for their services ("TPV Fees") from funds collected by them. Political Subdivision may execute the Service Level Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit "C" to designate the preference of Political Subdivision with respect to the assignment of Debt to TPVs. If no preference is indicated the Attorney General will assign Debt to TPVs in accordance with an established assignment strategy. TPV fees shall be paid at rates set by the Attorney General. The Parties agree that the Attorney General will pass all TPV Fees on to debtors as an additional obligation of the debtors.
- 4.4 Upon agreement the Attorney General may appoint special counsel to collect claims for Political Subdivision and to pay such special counsel for their services ("Special Counsel Fees") from funds collected by them. Political Subdivision may execute the Service Level Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit "C" to designate the preference of Political Subdivision with respect to the assignment of Debt to Special Counsel. If no preference is indicated the Attorney General will assign Debt to Special Counsel in accordance with an established assignment strategy. Special Counsel Fees shall be paid at rates set by the Attorney General. The Partics agree that the Attorney General will pass all Special Counsel Fees on to debtors as an additional obligation of the debtors.
- 4.5 Political Subdivision may execute a different Service Level Agreement for each category of debt certified pursuant to this Agreement, and each Service Level Agreement shall be attached as additional pages of Exhibit "C."
- 4.6 Political Subdivision may change or terminate the Service Level Agreement(s) attached hereto as Exhibit "C" upon appropriate written notice as specified therein, and any change or termination of the Service Level Agreement(s) shall not be construed as an amendment or termination of this Agreement.

V. DISBURSEMENT PROCESS/PAYMENT OF COLLECTION COSTS

5.1 On a weekly basis the Attorney General shall disburse to the Political Subdivision the full amounts collected on the Debt minus any applicable collection costs or fees as outlined herein. The Political Subdivision and Attorney General shall have the authority to settle or compromise any account in the Debt which is agreed upon by the Political Subdivision and Attorney General as payment in full based on the best interests of the Parties. At the time of the Attorney General's disbursement to the Political Subdivision, the Political Subdivision will receive the amount collected minus the Attorney General's collection costs and any applicable TPV Fees or Special Counsel Fees pursuant to this Agreement.

- 5.2 The Parties agree that court cases and judgment liens shall not be dismissed or deemed satisfied without the Political Subdivision's consent that all the fees have been paid by the debtor liable for costs under the court case and/or judgment lien.
- 5.3 Disbursements to the Political Subdivision of amounts due hereunder may be made via state check or by Automated Clearing House ("ACH") deposit, at the Attorney General's discretion. Political Subdivision acknowledges that the Attorney General prefers to remit all payments by ACH deposit, and Political Subdivision agrees to execute an ACH payment authorization in accordance with the form attached hereto as Exhibit "D" within thirty (30) days after the Effective Date of this Agreement.

VI. CERTIFICATION AND CANCELLATION OF DEBT

- 6.1. Political Subdivision will certify only Debt to the Attorney General which is past due and final, in accordance with O.R.C. § 131.02(A). O.R.C. § 131.02 provides that the Attorney General and Political Subdivision may determine an appropriate time beyond the regular 45-day requirement to certify delinquent debt. Such exceptions may be made as the Attorney General and the Political Subdivision mutually agree are appropriate.
- 6.2. The Parties acknowledge and agree that O.R.C. §131.02 empowers the Attorney General to, with the consent of the chief officer of an entity reporting a debt, cancel the debt or cause the same to be canceled. O.R.C. § 131.02(F)(2) provides a general statute of limitations of forty (40) years from the date of certification to collect claims. O.R.C. § 131.02(F)(1) allows the Attorney General to cancel uncollectible claims earlier, with the approval of the Political Subdivision. Political Subdivision may execute the Service Level Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit "C" to designate the preference of Political Subdivision. If no preference is indicated, the write off period will be fifteen (15) years after the date of certification. Exceptions revising the write off period for specified claims or categories of debt may be agreed to by the Attorney General and the Political Subdivision as amendments to the Service Level Agreement, and such amendments shall not be construed as an amendment or termination of this Agreement.

VII. CONFIDENTIALITY

7.1. Any confidential debtor information made available to Attorney General in the course of performance of this Agreement shall be used only for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Agreement pursuant to the Attorney General's statutory obligations. Additionally, the Attorney General shall not sell any debtor information to any third parties.

VIII. LIABILITY

8.1. Each Party shall be responsible for its own acts and omissions and those of its officers, employees and agents.

IX. CHOICE OF LAW

9.1. This Agreement is made and entered into in the State of Ohio and shall be governed and construed in accordance with the laws of Ohio. Any legal action or proceeding related to this Agreement shall be brought in Franklin County, Ohio, and the Parties irrevocably consent to jurisdiction and venue in Franklin County, Ohio.

X. COMPLIANCE WITH LAW

10.1. The Parties, in the execution of their respective duties and obligations under this Agreement, agree to comply with all applicable federal, Ohio and local laws, rules, regulations and ordinances.

XI. RELATIONSHIP OF THE PARTIES

- 11.1. It is fully understood and agreed that a Party's personnel shall not at any time, or for any purpose, be considered as agents, servants, or employees of the other Party.
- 11.2. Except as expressly provided herein, neither Party shall have the right to bind or obligate the other Party in any manner without the other Party's prior written consent.

XII. MODIFICATION

12.1. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties, and any changes or modifications to this Agreement shall be made and agreed to by the Parties in writing.

XIII. TERMINATION/EXPIRATION

- 13.1. Either party may terminate this Agreement for any reason by giving written notice, at least forty-five (45) days in advance of the date of termination, to the other Party via e-mail, facsimile transmission, mail, certified mail or personal delivery to the other Party's signatory to this Agreement.
- 13.2. If there is pending litigation in connection with any Debt, termination shall not be effective until the Attorney General terminates the legal representation in the litigation matter. The Attorney General shall be compensated for Debt collected and received prior to termination. The Parties agree to cooperate so as to effectuate a speedy and efficient transfer of the work to Political Subdivision.

The Parties agree that the following categories of debt may be certified to the Attorney General. All debt must be final with a minimum principal amount of \$100.00.

Examples of Categories of Debt to be certified:


- (a) Statutory fees as assessed by a Political Subdivision;
- (b) Civil court costs; and
- (c) Criminal court costs so long as the defendant is not incarcerated on the date the debt is certified.
- (d) Debt must be declared final with no chance of appeal or no future changes to the amount of the debt sent to the Attorney General for collection purposes.
- (e) Debt from a school system must be as a result of a contractual agreement.

Examples of Categories of Debt NOT to be certified:

- (a) Debt that is against a juvenile.
- (b) Debt against a presently incarcerated individual.
- (c) Debt that is involved in a bankruptcy, rental or foreclosure action.
- (d) Debt from any type of utility.
- (e) Debt resulting from code enforcement violations.
- (f) Debt that results from a red light camera violation/citation.


