## ASHVILLE COUNCIL REGULAR SESSION

The Council of Ashville convened in Regular Session from 6:36 PM to 7:41 PM in the Council Meeting Room at 200 East Station Street, Ashville, Ohio 43103. Mayor Wise called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

**MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING:** Randy Loveless moved, seconded by Roger Clark, to approve the March 18, 2019 minutes as presented. All votes were yea.

### **GUESTS:**

Micki Stiles of the Ashville Women's Civic Club reported that the club would like to have a village-wide clean-up day in June and have it advertised in the newsletter. Stiles stated that volunteers from TVHS will be participating, but other volunteers are welcome to participate as well. She questioned what part of SR 752 is in the village so that they can include that area in the clean-up. Council questioned the safety of having pedestrians walking on SR 752 and asked that it be referred to the Safety Committee. Stiles also asked if a set day could be agreed upon to be able to make this an annual event. Council agreed to work with the civic club to designate a day for an annual clean-up day.

Sandy Oliver asked when the potholes in the alley near her home will be filled in. Oliver also stated that she feels the village needs to hang more flags throughout the community to show its patriotism. Oliver stated that she is willing to lead the fundraising efforts to obtain more flags for the village.

Dennis Ward who owns the property located at 247 Powell Street asked if it is possible to use the alley near his home for access to his property. Ward noted that the property is land-locked and has to clear access to it. Ward also stated that he approached the village several years ago with the same issue and is hoping Council can help find a solution to his problem.

**MAYOR'S REPORT:** Mayor Wise reminded everyone about the annual chamber of commerce dinner on April 11.
