

Part of any community is the need to provide recreational areas. This provides for the health and vitality of that neighborhood. This LMI area would benefit from having a playground for children, a gazebo for seniors, and a dog park where all can meet. While all of this may not be constructed in one year, it provides a plan for the community into the future. This is the above ground benefits; below ground it will provide for better water runoff in rain events.

The project objective is the move the existing west-side park playground equipment to a larger area to the north. This north area cannot be developed or sold because of infrastructure below ground for the Water Resource Recovery Facility. The current park area can be developed. As part of that playground, make use of the retention pond improving water runoff control. To create walking trails, add a Gazebo or Shelter-House, Dog Park area and restroom facilities. This would could be done in Phases to allow for funding and construction, see Exhibit Two & Three.







WHEREAS, the improvement herein above described is considered to be a priority need for the community,

NOW, AND THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE VILLAGE COUNCIL, VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE, PICKAWAY COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO THAT:

SECTION ONE

The Mayor or Village Administrator is hereby authorized to submit an application to the Pickaway County Board of Commissioner for (CDBG) funding. That funding will be for two (2) projects:

Priority One: Phase One-Village of Ashville Westside Park Improvement Project (Playground

Equipment Relocation, Dog Park Construction, ADA Compliant)

Priority Two: Village of Ashville Westside Park Improvement Project (Playground Equipment

Relocation, Dog Park Construction, Stormwater Runoff Control, ADA Compliant)

The Council of Ashville will limit the expenditure for its portion of each of these projects to \$44,000.00 for Phase One Priority One. Priority Two would provide additional funds for Stormwater and surface water control. That limit would be \$66,000 with Phase One or \$100,000.00.
