HB 168 The Water and Wastewater Infrastructure Grant Program

It will provide nearly \$250 million to improve access to clean drinking water and wastewater infrastructure. Grants will be up to \$250,000 for design projects and up to \$5 million for construction projects to Ohio communities. Public entities within a political subdivision with the authority to own and operate public water and sewer systems and nonprofit, non-community public water systems may apply. Funding for the program is provided by the American Rescue Plan Act.
