On Sunday at 2:00 AM clocks are turned backward one hour to Sunday, November 4, 1:00 AM local standard time instead Thus sunrise and sunset will be about one hour earlier. There will be more light in the morning. This is also called Fall Back & Winter Time.



#### **Trick-or-Treat Safety Tips**

When taking your children out this Halloween for Trick-or-Treat, remember a few things that can help to keep them safe.

- Make sure that their costumes do not impede their ability to move or cause a tripping hazard.
- Make sure that the children have a full field of view when wearing masks.
- Hem your costumes so you don't trip and fall. Apply reflective tape to your Halloween cos-
- tumes. Avoid cumbersome masks. Use make-up instead.

- Use only hypoallergenic non-toxic makeup.
- Wear comfortable, practical shoes.
- 8. Double tie your shoelaces so you don't
- Watch for traffic when crossing the street or walking in areas where there are no side walks.
- 10. Do not go inside the houses of people you do not know.
- 11. If your children are going Trick-or-Treating without an adult, make sure they go in groups, never alone.
- 12. Check all candy before you allow your children to eat anything. Discard any candy or items that are open or otherwise appear to have been tampered with.
