The Court is headed by the magistrate, assisted by the Clerk of the Court and Bailiff of the Court, along with other Court staff. It is the Court's mission to provide efficient, fair resolution of all matters coming before it with due process, and to ensure that all Court users are afforded ready access to the Court. Our staff is dedicated to providing an environment so as to instill confidence in, and respect for, the judicial system in general, and Mayor's Court. That customer service by the court staff is given the highest priority.

The new schedule for Mayor's Court is the first and third Tuesday of every month, beginning at 4:15 pm.


