What does the Viking Festival, Post Office Letter Carriers, & a 4H Group have to do with the Ashville Food Pantry?

You may not have known this but the Viking Festival that was held on April 27th and 28th contributed 99 cases of food products to the Ashville Food Pantry. That was followed by the US Postal Service's Letter Carriers Stamp Out Hunger food drive on May 11th. Since 2009 following the Viking Festival 4H Club members called Critters and Creations have come to the Food Pantry to help sort the cases of food. This connection was inspired by Linda Cummins past Director of the Food Pantry.

The goal of the Viking Festival is to present a meaningful donation. This they have accomplished for over 15 years. Below is a picture of a 4-H Group helping sort the cases of food.

The Ashville Food Pantry provides food, free of charge, to those in need who live in the Teays Valley Local School District. Donations are always welcomed. They average 100 clients per month with the largest group over 65. Also, they are in need of funds to maintain their facility and keep their programs running strong. The Food Pantry is located at 94 Long Street and their most needed items are:

Spaghetti sauce, boxed potatoes, jelly, canned fruit, canned vegetables, cereal, laundry detergent, and boxes of Jell-O
