- 2019-16 An Ordinance to Make Temporary Appropriations for The Next Year's Expenses and Other Expenditures of the Village of Ashville, State of Ohio, Based upon the Certificate of Estimated Resources Issued by the Pickaway County Budget Commission for the Fiscal Year Beginning January 1, 2020, and Declaring an Emergency.
- 19-2019-16 A Resolution to authorizing the Mayor or Village Administrator to Submit a Grant Proposal (s) to the Pickaway County Park District for Their 2020 Park and Trail Grant Program.



The Village of Ashville Tax Department and Regional Income Tax Agency (RITA) are offering a one-time amnesty program for all non-filers (both residents and nonresidents) in conjunction with the current non-file mailing from RITA. This program is an




opportunity for individuals, who for any reason have fallen behind on their Village of Ashville income tax filing requirements to "get caught up" and have the late filing fee per year filed waived. The program will be offered for any past due returns filed between November 13, 2019 through January 31, 2020.


ASHVILLE VISION STATEMENT

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Seasonal Advice from the Village of Ashville Service & Police Department

While the weather has been mild, we are preparing the village for winter. The goal of the service department is to maintain the safe flow of traffic. The crews work around the clock as needed for snow plowing and salt application. The snowplows will clean the streets from curb to curb. You can help the service department during sleet, hail, ice, and snow removal. This can only be done if cars are not parked along the curb. Please remove car (s) to a place that has been plowed. They can be returned once plowed.

Main and secondary roads are given first priority for plowing and salting to assure emergency accessibility and to ease traffic congestion. Residential streets are plowed afterwards.

- Primary Streets = Main, Long, Station, Circleville Ave., & State Route 752
- Secondary Streets = Jefferson, Miller, Scioto, Cromley, East, Powell, Randolph, Walnut, Plum and Park.

All Remaining Streets in Ashville

Snow Parking Ban - Parking is prohibited in Village Business District when snow has accumulated to a depth of two (2) inches. Signs are posted in these designated areas.

Property owners are responsible for snow and ice removal from sidewalks in front of their property. Depositing of snow or ice onto any public street or sidewalk is prohibited. Snow must be kept on the property it falls. Snow from your driveway may not be taken across the street. Also, please keep fire hydrants and storm sewer drains clear.

If you need the Service Department, call 983–6367 and ask for Dave Ballard. He is our Service Dept. Superintendent and he will return your call. (We would like to call your attention to pot holes. If you happen to see them, please call 983-6367).

We thank the dedicated drivers for working long cold hours to make our streets safer to drive.
