

The Mayor's Column-2019 Paving Project

The 2019 Ashville Paving Project involves repairs and resurfacing of 19 locations in the Village.

- Lexington Ave.11. Maple St. 1. Madison Ave. 12. Gary Alley 2.
- 3. Miller Ave. 13. Station St. 4. Rich St.
- 14. Ruth Place 5. Cromley St. South St.
- 6. Cherry St. 16. Poplar St. 7 Harrison St. 17. Dowling Ave.
- 8. School St. 18. 200 E. Station 9. E. Main St. 19. Water Plant
- 10. Church St.

We will keep you informed about the locations. The intent is to use the sequence listed above beginning early in September. Most roads will be able to remain open but some may have to be closed during the milling and/or pavement. We recommend determining if you are impacted in a manner to affect driving or parking.

The order listed is for the removal and placement of 301. The surface will be placed at different times throughout. This schedule may change depending on the progress of the patching and actual weather conditions.






Debt Service Rate goes to \$6.06 from \$4.03

In the May 2015 Newsletter, Ashville published an article about the development of the Water Resource Recovery Facility. In that article the process was discussed and the establishment of a "Debt Service Charge" for financing development and constructions.

The facility began operation October 2017. The cost of development and construction was 16.5 million dollars. This has resulted in an annual payment to OWDA and OPWC of \$560,000. An increase is authorized by Ordinance 2019-11 and the new fee is \$6.06/1000 gallons. The first charge was 69¢ in 2014 was followed by \$1.29, \$1.95, \$2.63, \$4.03 and now in 2019 \$6.06. The objective was to have a graduation increase to determine what the final Debt Services after construction will be. Next year will be the culmination of this process. The growth of the village over time will reduce the per 1000 gallon. The pedestrian will wait until the LED flashing has begun. The next step is to confirm that traffic on St. Rt. 752 from the east and west has stopped. The pedestrian will need to verify that any vehicles on Ashton Woods Drive and the Teays Valley driveway have also stopped.

Don't assume!

The pedestrian can now proceed across the roadway. They should remained engaged with their surroundings and continue to monitor traffic. Specifically, the pedestrian should not be using their cell phone for texting or phone conversations. This device is 60% to 80% effective; therefore you need to be concerned about the % that may not see you or the flashing LED diodes.

Two more of these RRFB's devices are plan to be added to the streets in 2020. More information on this in future newsletters.
