

#### The State Route 316 Long and West Main Street Project Update

The project included stormwater, sidewalk, curbs, paving and landscaping. West Main Street has been completed all but the paving portion. Newcomer Concrete has moved from Main Street to Long Street. They will first work on the westside from south to north. Once the westside is completed they will move to the eastside and follow the same protocols. Once the project has been completed the infrastructure should be able to better handle rain events.
