Aspen Energy our Gas Aggregation Broker has negotiated an agreement with Constellation NewEnergy-Gas Division as our supplier. The rate will be



\$0.781. The agreement takes affect in September. You will be receiving communication about this information and given the opportunity to Opt-out.

You will be instructed on how to Opt-out. The Agreement and Exhibit A can be found at our website and can be accessed by clicking on the banner that looks like the image to the right.

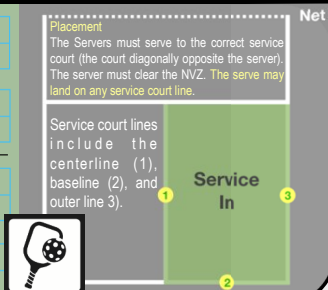
Wright and Long Street. Future newsletters will discuss how you can get involved in funding and possible work equity. Museum supporters, thanks for looking toward the future.
