#### Human Rights Commission The Board of Review

Ordinance 2022-13, authorized the creation of a Human Rights Commission. ordinance can be found www.ashvilleohio.gov under "Village Govern-

The intent is to protect and safeguard the right A Board of Review, consisting of a member of and opportunity of all persons to be free from all forms of discrimination, including discrimination based on one's membership in a Protected Class such as age, race, color, religion, ethnicity, national origin, ancestry, disability, marital status, family status, military status, sex, gender identity or expression, or sexual orientation ("Protected Class"). The purpose of this commission is to promote the public health and welfare of all persons who live in, work in, or visit the Village. It is further the intent to assure equal access to employment, housing, and public accommodations in the Village. The denial of these rights to persons in a Protected Class is contrary to the principles of freedom and equality of opportunity and is destructive to a free and democratic society.

Ordinance 2001-08, authorized the creation of a Tax Board of Review. That ordinance can be found at www.ashvilleohio.gov under "Village Departments" - "Tax Department". 181.10 BOARD OF REVIEW.

Council and two other Village resident individuals each to be appointed by the Mayor, is hereby created. The Board shall select for a oneyear term one of its members to serve as Chairperson and one to serve as Secretary. A simple majority of the members of the Board shall constitute a quorum. The Board shall establish its own rules of organization and procedure for the conduct of its business and keep a record of its proceedings. Such records of proceedings and hearings are not public records available for inspection under Section 149.43 of the Ohio Revised Code. Hearings requested before the Board by the taxpayer are not meetings of a public body subject to provisions of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

- ♦ Ordinance 2022-13 An Ordinance to Add Chapter 559 Discrimination Prohibited; Guarantee of Equality and Inclusion to the Village of Ashville Codified Ordinances and Declaring an Emergency.
- ♦ Ordinance 2022-14 An Ordinance to Amend 2003-11, 2006-02, 2006-08, 2009-09, 2009-20, 2013-02, 2013-05, 2014-05, 2016-06, 2017-05,2019-01, 2019-09, 2019-18, 2020-02, and 2020-12 to reflect Changes in the Village of Ashville Pay Ordinance. This Ordinance Designates Certain Village Employment Positions as Hourly Positions and Salaried. It Establishes Minimum and Maximum Pay Rates of Compensation for such Persons Employed in such Positions, and to Declare an Emergency.
- Resolution 12-2022 A Resolution Authorizing the Village Administrator and Fiscal Officer to Execute an Agreement and/or Purchase Order with Strand Associates to Conduct an Impact Fee Study and to Execute Other Contracts as Required.

#### Gas Aggregation Update

The rate you should see in September is \$0.781 per Ccf. If you do not see this contact Columbia Gas at 800/344-4077 or Constellation at 833/767-0875.

If you are on the Columbia Gas Budget Plan you may be paying a higher Ccf average rate. YOU HAVE TO GO OFF BUDGET TO SAVE NOW.

A Ccf is the volume of 100 cubic feet (cf). Your gas meter measures the volume of natural gas you use in hundreds of cubic feet (CCF). The difference between prior and present meter readings is your usage in hundreds of cubic feet. (CCF or therms).
