Trick-or-Treat Safety Tips

When taking your children out this Halloween for Trick-or-Treat, remember a few things that can help to keep them safe.

- Make sure that their costumes do not impede their ability to move or cause a tripping hazard.
- Make sure that the children have a full field of view when wearing masks.
- Hem your costumes so you don't trip and fall.
- Apply reflective tape to your Halloween costumes.

- Avoid cumbersome masks. Use makeup instead.
- Use only hypoallergenic and non-toxic makeup.
- ★ Wear comfortable, practical shoes.
- Double tie your shoelaces so you don't trip.
- Watch for traffic when crossing the street or walking in areas where there are no side walks.
- Do not go inside the houses of people you do not know.
- If your children are going Trick-or-Treating without an adult, make sure they go in groups, never alone.
- Check all candy before you allow your children to eat anything. Discard any candy or items that are open or otherwise appear to have been tampered with.

A Word from Planning & Zoning by Samantha Pemberton

Since I am working as the point person for all items related to the Planning & Zoning and the Building Department, I have discovered while people in the industry may know the language and terminology of planning & zoning, others do not. Therefore, I thought it would be helpful to provide one place to go for that information. As with all items related to Ashville Government go to our website www.ashvilleohio.gov. Then go to the "VILLAGE DEPARTMENTS" dropdown and click on "PLANNING & ZONING/BUILDING". On that page click on the green box that says "DEFINITIONS OF PLANNING & ZONING TERMS". It will take you to the Codified Ordinance Chapter 1107 page for Definitions. There are hundreds of planning & zoning formal words. 

Update on Utility Billing & SmartMeters

The Village of Ashville is in the process of completing conversion to the Neptune 360 Smart Meter and has updated our billing process with Muni-link. We now get a daily report (Dashboard) that looks like this:





The Neptune 360 Dashboard allows us to detect High Usage and Continuous Consumption information. That information is used to communicate what has been detected as water usage every hour. IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Neptune (NECO) has been contracted by the Village of Ashville to complete the installation of the 360 SmartMeter. If yours has not been changed, you will be contacted by them in the next few weeks. They will be installing 300 meters between October 10th and October 27th. You can contact NECO within the next two weeks to schedule an appointment for the installation.
